Mayor Francis X. Murray opened a Public Hearing regarding proposed Bill RVC 1806. A local law to amend the Code of the Village of Rockville Centre, in relation to the office of the Police Commissioner.

After hearing all interested persons in attendance, on motion of Trustee Oppenheimer, duly seconded by Trustee Baxley and carried by a vote of three to none, the Board closed the Public Hearing regarding proposed Bill RVC 1806.

On motion of Trustee Oppenheimer, duly seconded by Trustee Baxley and carried by a vote of three to none, the Board adopted proposed Bill RVC 1806 as Local Law 2 of 2018. A copy of the local law is on file with these minutes.

Mayor Francis X. Murray opened a Public Hearing for the purpose of adoption of the FY 2019 Budget, and requested that Village Financial Advisor John J. Joyce proceed with the review. Mr. Joyce presented the following Budget Message:

Fiscal Year 2019 Tentative Budget Message

The NYS Real Estate Property Tax Cap program has impacted the manner in which local governments develop their annual budgets. This program, initiated in 2012, established a formula that sought to limit Real Estate Property Tax Levy growth to 2.0% or the rate of inflation. Certain exceptions were added to the formula that permit municipalities to exceed the 2.0% levy growth limit yet still comply with the overall constraints in levy growth that was established by the program.

Based on the Tax Cap Program, the formula effecting the Fiscal Year 2019 real estate tax levy growth for Rockville Centre was a maximum 2.29%, The Village of Rockville Centre's FY2019 Tentative Budget contains a tax levy growth of 2.24% which is less than the cap limit established by the NYS Real Estate Property Tax Cap program.

In addition to the NYS Real Estate Property Tax Cap program, New York State had also implemented what was known as the Property Tax Freeze Credit Program. The tax freeze credit was a two year real estate tax relief program that reimbursed qualified NYS homeowners for increases in their real estate taxes. In prior years, because the Village was in compliance with this Property Tax Freeze Credit Program, qualified residents of the Village did benefit from a cash reimbursement from the state. It is important to note that this Program no longer exists, the last year being 2016 with refunds delivered in 2017.

Budget Summary

The total FY 2019 Tentative Budget amounts to \$44,798,180, representing an increase of \$67,069 or 0.15% above the FY 2018 Adopted Budget. The new real estate tax rate will be \$50.02 per \$100 of net assessed valuation, a 1.88% increase above the current real estate tax rate of \$49.10.

Assessed Valuation

The Village's total net assessed valuation increased from the prior fiscal year. Total net assessed valuation increased from \$59,399,012 in Fiscal Year 2018 to \$59,610,365 for Fiscal Year 2019, an increase of \$211,353. This represents a 0.36% increase in net assessed valuation and a gain of \$105,719 in real estate tax revenues utilizing the Tentative Budget tax rate of \$50.02.

Fund Balance

It is expected that the General Fund will complete FY 2018 with approximately \$4,500,000 in unassigned fund balance, none of which has been appropriated for the FY 2019 Tentative Budget.

Revenue Expectations for FY 2019

In addition to the amount raised by the tax levy, the Village anticipates raising an estimated \$15 million in revenue for fiscal year 2019 from other sources, the more significant items being:

- Parks and Recreation charges are expected to produce approximately \$2,000,000
- On Street Parking is anticipated to produce approximately \$1,423,000
- Fines and forfeitures are expected to produce approximately \$1,200,000
- Parking permit fees are anticipated to produce approximately \$1,230,000
- Building Permit fees are expected to produce approximately \$1,100,000
- Cable TV franchise fees are expected to produce approximately \$659,000
- Mortgage Tax revenue is expected to produce approximately \$450,000

Expenditure Expectations for FY 2019

The total Tentative Expense Budget amounts to \$44,798,180. The Village's largest budgeted expenses are Personal Services and Employee Benefits, combined accounting for nearly 71% of the total or \$31,489,146

- Personal Services budgets reflect the salary levels contained in the CSEA Clerical Unit contract that expired on May 31, 2016, the CSEA Supervisors Contract that expires on May 31, 2021, and the PBA contract that expires on December 31, 2021
- The anticipated expense for the Retirement Systems is approximately \$3,458,208 or an approximate increase of \$67,808 from the prior year modified budget
- The anticipated expense for Health Insurance is approximately \$6,300,000 or an approximate increase of \$732,400 from the prior year budget
- The anticipated expense for Workers Compensation is approximately \$900,000

In addition to the above employee costs:

- The anticipated expense for Debt Service is approximately \$4,189,813
- The anticipated expense for Sanitation Disposal fees is approximately \$1,200,000

Mayor Francis X. Murray asked Police Commissioner James Vafeades to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Mayor introduced Joan McNaughton the President the Lions Club. Joan McNaughton and members of the Lions Club presented the RVC Conservancy with a check in the amount of \$10,000.00 for a donation to "Mr. B's Playground".

Mayor Murray introduced Trustee Baxley who spoke about Erin Agoglia and Payton Waller who won the NYS Gymnastics Championship. Trustee Baxley presented the girls with certificates and congratulated them on their wonderful achievement.

Mayor Murray introduced Trustee Grillo who read a proclamation announcing April of 2018 "Autism Awareness Month". Mr. Anthony Cancellieri was unable to attend to accept the proclamation.

Mayor Murray introduced Trustee Oppenheimer who spoke about the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada award that was given to the Village of Rockville Centre for its budget report. This report provides transparency and information to the public on how the residents money was received in taxes and how the Village spends it. The report gives information to the Bond rating agency which gave the Village a very high rating. That rating reduces borrowing costs, reduces taxes and gives the Village the opportunity to achieve those results. Trustee Oppenheimer thanked the Comptroller's office personnel for all their hard work for the past year.

Mayor Murray introduced Trustee Oppenheimer who introduced Richard Law, a Fire Medic who on December 15, 2017 helped respond to a patient that was in cardiac arrest at Sportset gym. A staff person from the facility had placed and AED and Fire Medic Richard Law quickly checked for respiration and pulse, confirmed cardiac arrest and immediately began CPR. The patient was transported to South Nassau Hospital and was released on December 20, 2017. Trustee Oppenheimer thanked Richard Law for helping a neighbor and saving a life.

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Mayor Murray spoke about former Police Commissioner Gennario; Commissioner Gennario joined the Rockville Centre Police Department in 1986, after serving in the Marine Corps for four years from 1979 to 1983. He spent 12 years as an officer in the department, seven years as a sergeant and five years lieutenant before being appointed as the Village's police commissioner. He served on active duty from 1979-84, was active for Desert Shield/Desert Storm from 1990-91 and was in the Marine Corps Reserves until 2008. While in the military, Gennario's commands included infantry rifle and mortar platoons and a hazardous materials unit. He was also an infantry company commander and a recruit series commander as well as operations staff officer and liaison officer to NATO, South American and Caribbean forces. Throughout his tenure as Commissioner, he managed a full-service police department for the Village and was responsible for overseeing sworn police officers who provide the full range of police services to the community, including patrol, investigative, crime prevention, 24/7 communications center and community service functions. Mayor spoke for the entire Board and residents and thanked Commissioner Gennario for his tireless efforts and dedication to the Village. Mayor Murray thanked him for his years of service and wished him the best in his future endeavors. Commissioner Gennario was unable to attend the meeting, and Mayor Murray and the Board of Trustees asked Police Commissioner Vafeades to accept a clock that will be presented to Police Commissioner Gennario at a later date.

Mayor Murray introduced Trustee Grillo and asked him to speak on the retirement of Inspector Quinn. Inspector Quinn served the Village of Rockville Centre for 32 years. He joined the department in 1985 and was named Police Officer of the Year in 1992 for his diligence, dedication to duty and highly professional conduct. He was promoted to sergeant in 1997, to lieutenant in 2002 and to inspector in 2010. In 2010 Inspector Quinn graduated from the FBI's National Academy. Inspector Quinn is a true professional and great role model for the rank-and-file of our Police Officers and is a true asset to the Rockville Centre Police Department. Inspector Quinn will truly be missed, and the Village wishes him the best in his retirement and future endeavors.

Mayor Murray administered the Oath of office to Police Commissioner James Vafeades and welcomed Police Commissioner Vafeades to his new position. Commissioner Vafeades has been with the Rockville Centre Police Department for over 28 years; he attended St. John's University where he graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Accounting, as well as a minor in Management, he attended the FBI's National Academy in 2011 and most recently Molloy College with a Master of Science degree in Criminal Justice. Commissioner Vafeades began his career as a Police Officer in March of 1990 and was promoted to Police Sergeant in December of 2002 and to Police Lieutenant in January of 2010. His duties included supervision of all personnel, management of the police department budget, scheduling, licensed premise oversight, grant management, and asset forfeiture administration, supervising special events and leading successful local and federal crime investigations. He is also

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involved in several community programs, including the RVC Coalition for Youth. Police Commissioner Vafeades years of experience and expertise will help to continue the strong relationship between our community and Police Officers. Mayor Murray is certain that he will lead with great integrity and competence.

Mayor Murray introduced Trustee Sepe and asked him to speak about our new Police Inspector Kenneth Schaefer. Lieutenant Schaefer has been a Police Officer for more than three decades. He attended Nassau Community College and SUNY Old Westbury. After graduating from the New York City Police Academy, he served as a New York City Transit Police Officer before being appointed to the Rockville Centre Police Department in 1989.
