Mayor Murray introduced Deputy Mayor Baxley who introduced and congratulated the Boys Catholic Middle Spirit League, and the  $6^{\rm th}$  and  $8^{\rm th}$  grade girls CYO Basketball Teams. Deputy Mayor Baxley and Trustee Conlon presented all the Champions with certificates and congratulated them on this accomplishment.

Mayor Murray introduced New York State Assemblyman Brian Curran, Assemblyman Curran wanted to thank all that voted for him, and that he hope to have the trust and support from all during the next two years.

Trustee Grillo announced that the Fire Department held its regular Council Meeting on February 21, 2023, and read the following report regarding changes to the department membership. "We regret to report the passing of Honorary Chief Edward Sompson of Live Oak Engine Co. No. 1, Ex Captain Remy Jean-Francois has rejoined Alert Engine Co. Prayers and condolences to his family and friends, and to the Rockville Centre Fire Department, and to Rockville Centre Live Oak Engine Company No. 1."

WHEREAS, the Village of Rockville Centre has agreed to participate in the Nassau County Community Development Consortium for the 2023-2024 Program Year commencing on or about September 1, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Rockville Centre has developed certain Community Development project activities and funding allocations for said activities after holding Community Development Citizens Advisory Committee Meetings, a Public Hearing; and providing public information statements and notices, all pursuant to HUD regulations.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that acting for the Village of Rockville Centre, the Village Board of Trustees hereby approves the following activities for the 2023-2024 Community Development Block Grant program:

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On motion of Trustee Conlon, duly seconded by Trustee Sepe and unanimously carried the Board adopted the following resolution to publish a legal notice for a public hearing regarding the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget.

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RESOLVED, that the Village Administrator is authorized and directed to publish and post a legal notice for a public hearing to be held on April 3, 2023, at 7:00 pm, with respect to the adoption of the Village's budget for the fiscal year 2024, in the form and in the manner required by law.

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On motion of Deputy Mayor Baxley, duly seconded by Trustee Sepe and unanimously carried, the Board authorized the Mayor or his designee to enter into an agreement with the Nassau County Board of Elections to allow the Recreation Center to be used for early voting from Saturday October 28, 2023 through and including Sunday, November 5, 2023 for a total amount received of \$2,500.00-.

On motion of Trustee Grillo, duly seconded by Trustee Sepe and unanimously carried, the Board approved a change order for additional funds in the amount of \$10,000.00 for the Flowbird application due to the increased usage of the application during Fiscal Year 23.

On motion of Deputy Mayor Baxley, duly seconded by Trustee Conlon and unanimously carried, the Board adopted the following resolution authorizing grant acceptance for inclusive playground complex at Veterans' Park.

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# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING GRANT ACCEPTANCE FOR INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND COMPLEX AT VETERANS' PARK

WHEREAS, the Village has received notification of a grant offered to the Village by the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York (DASNY), pursuant to grant SAM 25292 in the total amount of \$550,000 (allocated \$250,000 for the playground, \$150,000 for lighting,

and \$150,000 for ADA compliant restroom) to be purchased for the Inclusive Playground Complex at Veterans' Park, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees finds and concludes that it is in the best interests of the Village to accept such grant, and to enter into required grant agreements with DASNY,

## NOW, THEREFORE, BET

RESOLVED: that the Mayor, Village Administrator and Village Attorney are each hereby authorized to sign on behalf of the Village documents reasonably required by DASNY and other agencies of the State of New York, in furtherance of the Village's receipt of grant SAM 25292 in the total amount of \$550,000 (allocated \$250,000 for the playground, \$150,000 for lighting, and \$150,000 for ADA compliant restroom) to be purchased for the Inclusive Playground Complex at Veterans' Park.

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On motion of Trustee Sepe, duly seconded by Trustee Grillo and unanimously carried, the Board adopted the following SEQRA Type II resolution for the purchase of body cameras and rehabilitation of Park Lane.

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# SEQRA TYPE II RESOLUTION PURCHASE OF BODY CAMERAS AND REHABILITATION OF PARK LANE

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees hereby finds and concludes that the Board of Trustees is the Lead Agency with respect to environmental impact review of (a) the proposed rehabilitation of Park Lane in the Village of Rockville Centre, and (b) the proposed purchase of police body cameras for use by Village police personnel,

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees hereby finds and concludes that:

- (a) the proposed rehabilitation of Park Lane in the Village of Rockville Centre is a Type II action pursuant to 6 NYCRR 617.5(c)(1), (5) and (6), and
- (b) the proposed purchase of police body cameras for use by Village police personnel is a Type II action pursuant to 6 NYCR 617.5(c)(31),

and it is further.

RESOLVED, that pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act neither of such proposed actions requires any further environmental impact review.

On motion of Trustee Sepe, duly seconded by Trustee Grillo and unanimously carried, the Board approved a Personal Service Contract with SJS Associated, Susan J. Stohr, Government Affairs Consultant for New York Association of Public Power (NYAPP) for the Incorporated Village of Rockville Centre's portion of these costs for the period of March 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023 for an amount not to exceed \$15,523.60, in a form to be approved by the Village Attorney.

On motion of Deputy Mayor Baxley, duly seconded by Trustee Conlon and unanimously carried, the Board approved Departmental Budget Transfers from June 1, 2022, through February 28, 2023.

Action Item VII number 1 was removed from the agenda.

On motion of Trustee Grillo, duly seconded by Trustee Conlon and unanimously carried, the Board approved a change order for Bid No. 2010CD2(1001) Smith Pond Project with G & M Earth Moving, Inc., for additional quantities and items above the original purchase order amount for a total approved change order in the amount of \$213,872.65-.

On motion of Deputy Mayor Baxley, duly seconded by Trustee Grillo, and unanimously carried, the Board convened in executive session at 7:48pm to discuss pending litigation and matters leading to the appointment, employment, promotion, demotion, discipline, suspension, dismissal or removal of a particular person, and legal advice.

Commissioner Vafeades was present for part of the executive session discussion.

The Board discussed various matters without taking any action.

On motion of Trustee Conlon, duly seconded by Trustee Baxley and unanimously carried, the Board closed the executive session and returned to public session at 8:40pm.

The Board discussed the draft tentative budget.
