On motion of Trustee Oppenheimer, duly seconded by Trustee Howard and unanimously carried, the Board voted to approve the attendance of Police Commissioner Charles Gennario at the New York State Association of Chiefs of Police 2015 Annual Training Conference in Saratoga Springs, NY from July 12, 2015 through July 16, 2015 at a cost of \$1,400.00-.

On motion of Trustee Oppenheimer, duly seconded by Trustee Howard and unanimously carried, the Board voted to approve the following resolution with respect to training requirements for the Board of Appeals and the Planning Board.

Whereas, New York State Village Law §7-712(7) requires that members and alternates of the Board of Appeals attend at least four hours of training sessions annually in order to remain eligible for Board membership or for reappointment to the Board; and

Whereas, New York State Village Law §7-728 (7-a) contains similar requirements for members and alternates of the Planning Board; and

Whereas, each of the aforesaid statutes authorizes the Board of Trustees to waive or modify the training requirements if the Board of Trustees determines that it is in the best interests of the Village to do so; and

Whereas, a review of the training sessions attended by members of the Board of Appeals and Planning Board to date indicates a lack of compliance with the State requirements on the part of some Board members and only partial compliance on the part of others, apparently due to a misunderstanding whether the Village had waived the training requirements in whole or in part; and

Whereas, the Village carefully reviews the qualifications of all appointees to the Board of Appeals and Planning Board, to determine that each of them has background, education and experience which qualifies each appointee to serve as a member of such Board; and

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Whereas, each such Board has experienced and qualified counsel and staff to assist the Board members and alternates in the performance of their duties and to provide education and guidance with respect to legal requirements and other relevant issues; and

Whereas, the Board of Trustees hereby finds that it is in the best interests of the Village if the requirement that members and alternate members of the Board of Appeals and Planning Board attend training sessions were waived, and replaced by a policy of the Village that, where feasible, such members and alternate members attend training sessions as may be provided by the Village and other organizations;

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Rockville Centre hereby finds and determines as follows:

- 1. The qualifications and experience of the members and alternates of the Board of Appeals and Planning Board are carefully reviewed by the Board of Trustees prior to appointment or reappointment of any such member or alternate, to the end that all such persons are qualified by reason of background, education, training and experience to perform the duties of their respective positions;
- 2. the Village of Rockville Centre makes available to each such member or alternate experienced and qualified counsel and staff to assist such Board members in performing their respective duties;
- 3. the Village of Rockville Centre expects members and alternate members of the Board of Appeals and Planning Board to attend appropriate training sessions as required by State law, effective with members and alternate members serving on each such Board in the 2015-2016 Village official year and thereafter;

and it is further

RESOLVED, that for the foregoing reasons, the Board of Trustees hereby concludes that it is in the best interest of the Village that the Board of Trustees exercise its statutory authority, and the Board does hereby exercise such authority, to waive the requirements that members and alternates on the Board of Appeals and Planning Board attend mandatory training as a condition of qualification for appointment or reappointment to such Boards; and it is further

RESOLVED, it is the policy of the Village of Rockville Centre, that all members and alternate members of the Board of Appeals and Planning Board serving in or after the official year 2015-2016 are encouraged to participate in educational programs provided by the Village and other qualified organizations to enhance their knowledge of applicable laws and procedures related to their duties.

The Board reviewed the 7-13-15 agenda and the Briefing Session agenda without taking any further action.

On motion of Trustee Oppenheimer, duly seconded by Trustee Howard and unanimously carried, the Board voted to convene in Executive Session at 6:45 p.m. to obtain legal advice and to discuss pending and potential litigation.
