WHEREAS, the Village has offered the Plan in draft form for public comment to all citizens in the locality and, prior to adoption of the Plan by the local legislative body, has conducted public hearings to receive public comment, and has considered the comments submitted;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees finds and concludes that the adoption of the Plan is in compliance with Executive Order 203, and is in the best interests of the Village and its residents; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees hereby adopts the Plan in the form presented at the March 28, 2021 meeting of the Board of Trustees, which Plan is on file in the Village office; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Mayor is authorized and directed to complete and submit certification of the adoption of the Plan, and a copy of the Plan, to the Director of the New York State Division of the Budget on or before April 1, 2021 at EO203Certification@budget.ny.gov, and at such other address(es) as may be appropriate or required.

SEQRA NEGATIVE DECLARATION AMENDMENT OF OFFICIAL MAP

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees ("Board") is considering approval of amendments to the Village Official Map, and related actions, to reflect discontinuance of portions of Brooklyn Avenue, Chestnut Street and State Streets as public streets, and to establishment of a new public street to be known as Birch Lane, with respect to which a public hearing is scheduled to be held on April 29, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed a Short Environmental Assessment Form with respect to such proposed actions,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Board hereby finds and concludes that

(a) the Board is the Lead Agency for review of environmental impact of the proposed actions;

(b) the proposed actions are classified as an Unlisted Action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act and its implementing regulations (hereinafter collectively referred to as "SEQRA");

(c) the Board has considered an Environmental Assessment Form prepared with respect to the proposed actions;

(d) in the course of the said review, the Board has considered the following factors, among others, and hereby makes the following findings with respect to each of the following factors:

(i) the proposed actions would not result in any substantial adverse change in existing air quality, ground or surface water quality or quantity, traffic or noise levels, nor any substantial increase in solid waste production, nor create a substantial increase in the potential for erosion, flooding, leaching or drainage problems;

(ii) the proposed actions would not result in the removal or destruction of large quantities of vegetation or fauna, substantial interference with the movement of any resident or migratory fish or wildlife species, impacts on a significant habitat area, substantial adverse impacts on a threatened or endangered species of animal or plant, or the habitat of such a species, or other significant adverse impacts to natural resources;

(iii) the proposed actions would not impair the environmental characteristics of any Critical Environmental Area;

(iv) the proposed actions would not conflict with the community's current plans or goals as official approved or adopted;

(v) the proposed actions would not impair the character or quality of important historical, archeological, architectural or aesthetic resources or of existing community or neighborhood character;

(vi) the proposed actions would not result in a major change in the use of either the quantity or type of energy;

(vii) the proposed actions would not create a hazard to human health;

(viii) the proposed actions would not create a substantial change in the use , or intensity of use, of land, including agricultural, open space or recreational resources, or in its capacity to support existing uses;

(ix) the proposed actions would not encourage or attract large numbers of persons to any place for more than a few days, compared to the number who would come to such place without such action;

(x) the proposed actions would not create changes in two or more elements of the environment, but when taken considered together would result in a substantial adverse impact on the environment;

(xi) the proposed actions would not create substantial adverse impacts when considered cumulatively with any other actions, proposed or in process;

(xii) the proposed actions would not result in substantial adverse impact with respect to any relevant environmental consideration, including noise, aesthetics, traffic, air quality, water quality or adequacy of water supply, drainage, soil conditions, or quality of life in the community in general and the immediate neighborhood in particular; and

(e) the Board further finds and determines that;

(i) the proposed actions would not have a significant adverse environmental impact;

(ii) minor and/or insignificant environmental impacts which may result from the proposed actions will be reviewed, and in the event the same should be necessary in the opinion of the Board, can be dealt with by the imposition of appropriate conditions in the event of approval of the proposed actions or any of them; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Mayor is authorized on behalf of the Village to execute Parts 2 and 3 of the Environmental Assessment Form in accordance with the foregoing findings and determination.
